Overview: The seventh grade social studies curriculum focuses on map skills, physical and human geography, and historical facts about regions in the world. Students will analyze the physical, human and cultural geography of North America, Latin America, Africa, Southwest Asia, Australia, Oceania and Antarctica using the Five Themes of Geography and the Eight Elements of Culture. Skills including reading maps, interpreting graphs, charts and diagrams, absolute and relative location and measuring distance using a scale bar will also be taught.
