**BCIU** - Mrs. Huhn reported items from the meeting held October 18, 2012 during which they authorized an agreement with Eduplanet 21 for a custom built social learning consortium. Agreements were approved to provide Title I services for non-public students in many districts, including Brandywine Heights. Mrs. Huhn also noted upcoming professional development events.

**BCTC** - Mr. Bollinger reported items from the meeting held October 24, 2012 during which they received the findings of the independent audit for 2011-12. Discussion included the decline in student enrollment. The committee also recognized local students who placed at the Oley Fair. November 12 will be the reorganization meeting.

**Berks EIT/Berks TCC** – Mrs. Lamaestra reported no meeting was held in October. The next Berks EIT meeting is November 27, 2012.

**Council on Legislative Action** – Mr. Heffner called attention to the current PSBA agenda and referred the report to Mr. Scheetz. As the chosen delegate, Mr. Scheetz represented the Brandywine Heights School Board at the 2012 PSBA Legislative Policy Council Meeting in Hershey on October 18, 2012. Mr. Scheetz shared a copy of the PSBA Legislative Platform binder and reported on the following topics:

- A proposal to add to the platform support for legislation which removes work stoppage and strikes as bargaining tactics from the collective bargaining unit was disapproved. This topic prompted extended discussion.
- A proposal to support new legislation that requires Charter and Cyber-Charter schools to be subject to the same laws and regulations as public schools was approved.
- The support of voluntary in-service education for school directors was approved, and also a topic of much discussion.
- The support of legislation that restores the authorization for any school district to levy and collect mercantile or business privilege taxes was disapproved. Discussion focused on nuisance taxes and growing versus costing the economy.

Student Representatives – Adam Pritchard and Zachary Miller reported on the following activities:

- Select High School students participated as counselors at 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Camp, and reflected positively on the experience.
- The High School held a mock election on Monday, November 5; Obama was the winner.
- The Minstrels are performing "Bon Voyage" at the High School with show times through Sunday, November 11.
