Curriculum/Instruction:

1. Future Ready PA Index: Career Readiness Indicators

 As part of PDE's new dashboard (School Performance Profile replacement), School Districts are required to provide evidence that specific Career Education and Work (CEW) standards are being met. Through coordinated efforts, the BHASD has solidified where, when, and how this evidence will be collected.

2. Curriculum Writing

 K-12 Library and World Language curriculum has been completely revised and will be ready for Board approval in March..

3. Oley Valley Agricultural Engineering Program

 On 1/24 a team from BHASD visited Oley Valley SD to review their agricultural program, as well as discuss a possible partnership to better provide additional opportunities for BHASD families.

Technology:

1. Single Sign-On (SSO) Research

 In an effort to maximize instructional time, the BHASD is researching a single sign-on solution that would integrate with active directory and our digital, curricular resources.

2. ADA Website Compliance

• The BHASD continues investigating solutions to best ensure compliance with the federal regulations.

3. Mail Filter

• The BHASD successfully transitioned to our improved mail filter.

4. BotNet Attack

 Currently, the district is battling a BotNet attack which is attempting to consume network resources. The BotNet is currently quarantined. We expect to be able to remove it completely by February 16th.

5. Wireless Display Solutions

 The BHASD staff/students currently utilizes WiD boxes to wirelessly display their screen. These boxes have worked adequately; however, when showing video, are unable to stream effectively. Research is ongoing regarding possible replacement.

Athletics:

1. Character Education

Caron Leadership Academy: Coaches are in the process of selecting team leaders from each PIAA recognized sport in our district to attend a kickoff event on March 13, 2018, to be held at Schuylkill Valley High School. At this event, student athletes will be given information about workshops that they will attend during the preseason of the 2018/2019 SY. This Leadership Academy will assist in developing positive team leaders. In addition, student athletes will hear a presentation called Peak Performance: Substance Use Prevention and Education for Athletes. After the trainings, team leaders, along with a Caron Student Assistance Specialist, will take back to their team the skills and knowledge acquired and help facilitate the Peak Performance program with their teammates.
